Peace Pagoda Major Repair Progress Report

Birmingham Peace Pagoda recently celebrated its 20th anniversary on 22nd July 2018. Major renovation of the pagoda started before summer. Offering Gold Robe to Pagoda and concrete foot path around pagoda was completed in July. Pagoda roof repair continue to take place in autumn. The roof suffers from leakage sometimes ago and requires thorough attention of repair. Therefore, pagoda Trustee seeks advice from different engineering experts and repair work started in September.

Original roofing membrane is now removed. The old felt have been cleaned and left in place as a secondary protect layer and repaired any damage. A new vapour barrier has now been installed. A new cut to fall system is installed to move the water to the outlets and bring the building up to current building regulations. The cut to fall insulation is fixed and the liquid waterproofing layer is installed. A metal drip to enhance the existing drip from the concrete of the base of the Pagoda is also in place for better protection.

All major roof repair work successfully completed in October and the roof leakage is resolved. We are now continuing with internal pagoda renovation. Thank you all for your generous donations. Our Peace pagoda will be safe and stay strong with your continuous support.





Proposal for Teaching Buddhism in the West

Dr Rewatadhamma 30/10/2003



Birmingham Buddhist Vihara was established in 1981 with the aim of propagating the Buddhist teachings in the West, both through the medium of meditation and study of the scriptures. Over the years our capacity has grown, especially after the opening of the Dhammatalaka Peace Pagoda and then of the establishment of the Sangharama Monastery in its grounds. Our activities are now more than purely local. Some of the monks staying there teach regularly in a number of places and receive invitations from various organisations both in Britain and abroad.


This year seven monks are keeping the Vassa, which makes us one of the larger monastic communities in Britain. We hold meditation classes for beginners as well as our long-term more practised supporters. On another day we hold Scripture Classes and there are classes in more general studies over the weekend. Almost every month there is a meditation retreat and twice a year a ten-day retreat with an international attendance. Others come from Europe for private study and meditation retreats. As well as young samaneras, an increasing number of mature adults, both male and female, have also been taking temporary ordination. In addition, we have emphasised our educational role among the general population from the beginning and have hosted a growing number of visits from schools of all levels as well as colleges and universities most weeks of the year.

As well as our teaching function, our aim has been to work in a missionary capacity. Our envisaged activities in this respect are two-fold:

- 1. To give basic training to those who will then go on to the East for further training. This has often included those who have taken the robe either as Theravadins or in Mahayana tradition, with whom we have a special relationship. Our ability to further this was formerly not as well resourced as it is now.
- 2. We now have the capacity to train those of Eastern origin who have completed their Buddhist studies and now wish to learn English and have experience of adapting their teaching methods to Western cultural expectations.

Our present residential capacity is for ten monks/males and four nuns/females. However, in furtherance of our aims, we have plans for a large Dhamma Hall which will include kitchen facilities and provision of 10 meditation cells with separate washing facilities for men and the same number for women. Such extra accommodation will allow us to house an overspill from the monastic premises as well as meditators on long retreat. We have planning permission for this and are currently hoping to raise £300,000 to cover the costs. We are, therefore, taking this opportunity to appeal to our supporters, devotees and well-wishers to contribute towards our valuable work.

The four wives of a dying husband



There was a man who had 4 wives, he loved the fourth one very dearly, he would get her the nicest dress. He would get her the nicest jewellery, he would dress her very nicely and entertain with her all the time. She loved him, he loved her.

He also loved the third wife. The third wife was also dear to him, he would give her everything, she was the one who controlled everything in his life.

He also loved the second wife, he was also confident in her, she was the one to whom he would tell all his personal matters, he would always talk to his second wife about life.

His first wife was there, he wasn't too attached to her, she was always there, she was modest, always trying her best to show herself.

One day the man fell ill and he was on his death bed, all of his wives were gathered around him, he said "Now look, my beautiful wives, I don't want to die alone, who of you will come to me?"

He called his fourth wife and said "You are the dearest to my heart, I have always loved you, I have given you the best of all, now the time has come for me to die, will you come with me? would you come with me?" The wife said "No" and turned back and went away. His heart was broken into pieces.

Sadly he called his third wife to the front and said "I am going to die, will you come with me?" to that she said "No way, the moment you die, I am going with somebody else" she turned her back and went away.

He called his 2nd wife and asked her the same question, she said "I am sorry that you are dying, but I can only come up to your cemetery, I will be with you until there" and turned back to stand in her place.

From behind he heard a voice "I will come with you", he looked at his first wife and felt sad, he said "My dear I have always neglected you, you look so skinny, now my life has come to an end, I wish I knew you loved me more than anybody when I was healthy. I feel very sad I neglected you all this time" and died.

In the story, 4th wife represents the body and its craving, which we lose when we die. The 3rd wife represent wealth, which others get after one leaves body. The 2nd wife all the friends and family who can only come up to the grave. The 1st wife represents the soul (or mind), it is always there but unnoticed, the most dearest and important one is ignored and one often realizes it only at the end of life.

Now is the time to strive spiritually, take all the chances you get and benefit. Before the oil of life is completely lost.
